Click the icon, or press CTRL+U.

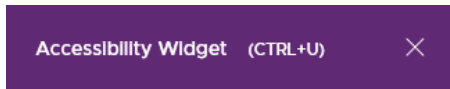

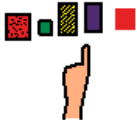
