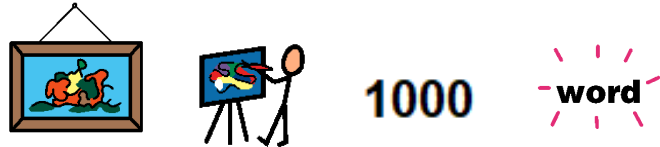
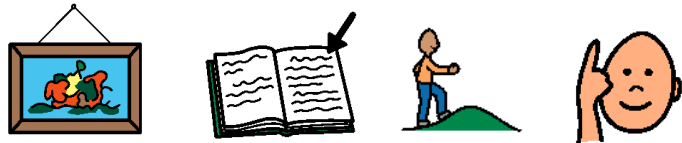

Picture Communication Symbols (PCS) are used by people who need help communicating, where signing,



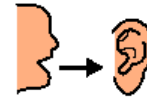

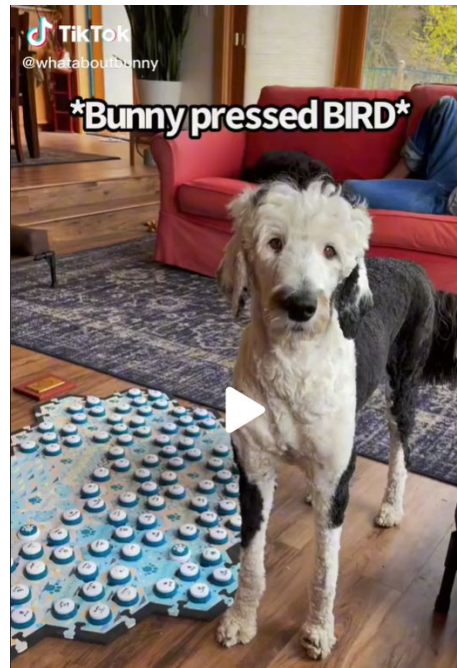
Bunny the Dog has learnt to communicate this way!



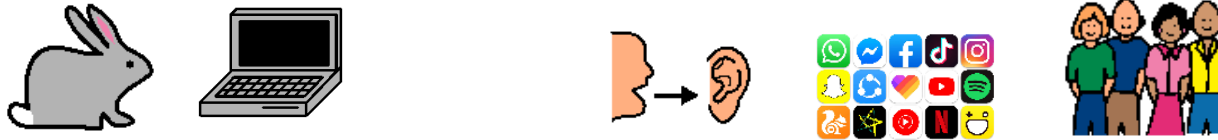
Bunny (a Tik Tok star), is famous for talking to her owners via a board of buttons recorded with words.

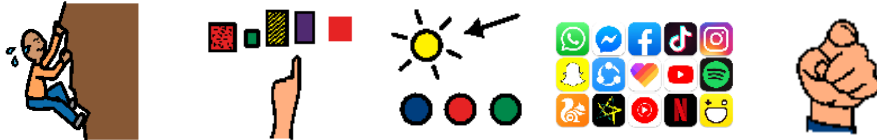

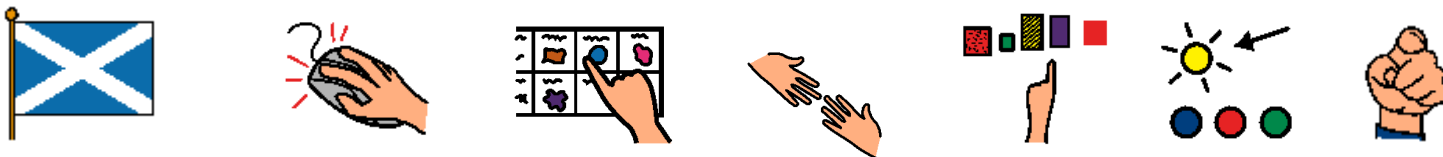

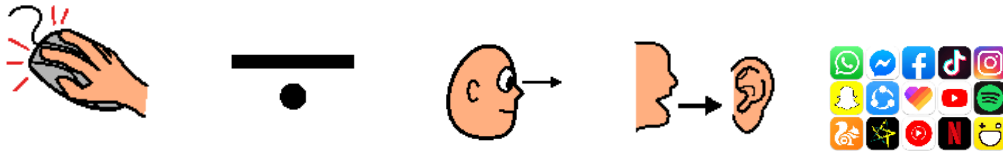
